The Barn Classroom is an exciting new addition to FMH. It is a group classroom where all the students from the main home come every day. The first group to the barn in the morning is the E-girls. Tina, Raeanne, and I usually go get our pony, Bob, from the pasture and bring him to the barn for the day. After that we begin feeding some of the animals and cleaning out their stalls.

At 9:30 the D-boys come in. Jolan and I finish cleaning out the stalls, and then we haul the muck down to the farm where it is turned into compost. At 10:15 the B-boys show up. Eric and David sweep the barn while Jared feeds our little flock of chickens and Joe gives the animals fresh water.

After lunch our pony, Bob, gets groomed by the B-girls. Nicole stops by in the afternoon to collect the eggs, and she greatly enjoys finding them and bringing them in to me while loudly proclaiming, "I found one, Jared, I found one!"

Whenever the weather is nice enough to go outside, pony cart rides are a highlight for all the students. Christopher especially loves to ride on the cart and he makes his request known first thing as he enters the barn. With a smile on his face he asks me, "Dauft ich cart ride?" (May I have a cart ride?)

Some of the other animals that the students care for throughout the day are rabbits, some sheep and goats, and a dog. There is even a pot-bellied pig, Petunia, that gets to go on a walk now and then and captures the students interest.

It is a blessing for me to get to know each one of the students and to be able to teach them. It has been a significant learning experience for me as well. I love the opportunity to build relationships with the students and watch them interact with the animals.
