Welcome to Classroom B, or B-School as it is better known. A little happy place in the basement of Faith Mission Home, B-School is one of our five one-on-one classrooms. I have 12 students that come to me throughout the day for 30 minute classes. My classes all start out with a cheerful, "Good morning," after which we sing at least one song and pray.

I wish so much you could pop into my class and watch Lialana nearly shake with excitement when I sing "You are My Sunshine." I wish you could talk to Christopher about food and watch him get all fired up about nachos and cookies, or sing "Well Done" to George and watch him light up.

What are some of the purposes of B-School? Like all of our one-on-one classrooms, B-School is made for just that, giving the students good quality one-on-one time. Although our childcare workers give the students excellent care, these one-on-one classrooms are special places where the students can get the full attention of the staff for half an hour before stepping back into their busy schedules. Another purpose of B-School is to help develop the academic, motor, and social skills that help them feel accomplished. That looks different for each of my students. Tina knows her math facts and loves science and history. Janae is learning to tie a square knot and play simple songs on the piano. Jolan is always memorizing Bible passages, although he can already quote many verses. Sophia works hard at speaking clearly or on letter flashcards. Belinda often reads numbers written on beanbags and throws them into a basket. Jeffrey is just starting to string together sounds and I have confidence that some day we will be able to hold a conversation.

In my 11 months in the B-School classroom, I have learned so, so much. I have learned how to better communicate and even hold a conversation with someone who can't use words to express what they're thinking. I've learned about showing love, patience, and kindness, even when I don't feel like it. I think one of the biggest things I've learned is how weak I am. I couldn't help in the amazing work of Faith Mission Home on my own strength. B-School has taught me so much about looking to God for my inspiration, courage, strength, and love to pour out on my students.

As I come to the end of my time in B-School and look back over my term, I feel incredibly grateful to be a part of this work in the hills of Virginia. Continue to pray for the work of Faith Mission Home.
